

Woodcreek Oaks October Meeting – Another informative meeting while welcoming a new neighbor, a new police officer, and a new firefighter! Officer Gary Cole and Officer Brainard brought us up to date on neighborhood happenings including the fact that stolen vehicles have increased recently. Especially Ford F150s. And apparently the holiday spirit has gotten into thieves as well as package thefts are again increasing. In addition, construction thefts are up and, sad to hear, many juveniles seem to be involved in this.

Make sure to keep your garage door closed and your door locked even if you're just running inside or to the back for a few minutes. The police have found that the owner starts the car as they prepare to leave. Then they run into the house to grab a forgotten item or hustle a slow passenger. A lurking thief uses that couple of minutes to snag the remote from the car. The residents leave. The thief opens the garage door and has a field day. Thief takes off and the residents often don't notice the remote is gone. Until, of course, they come back and find their garage missing items! One interesting note – gated communities seem to have about the same level of safety/robberies as non-gated!

One of our neighbors mentioned that he had spotted graffitti at one of the parks. Officer Coleman shared the happy news that gang activity is very minor in Roseville. And that the graffitti was reported AND cleaned up the same day! KUDOS to Roseville Police Department!

The sad thing about heroin is that HEROIN KILLS! Roseville Police Department have all been trained on Narcan and carry it to help when they find someone having a heroin overdose.

Roseville Fire – Our fire fighters reminded us that DAYLIGHT SAVINGS TIME is coming up on NOVEMBER 5, 2017. FALL BACK one hour AND change the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. They also pointed out that dust in the smoke detector can set them off. So be sure to dust them. Also, as heaters are going on, be aware that it's normal to have a dusty burning smell. I was intrigued to learn that the smell is because the dust is actually burning a bit – quite normal.

West Roseville Petition – Our neighbors, Fiddyment Farms, have a petition to extend at least a partial 2-lane extension of Blue Oaks Boulevard through to Westbrook Boulevard now!
